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Section 1: Institutional Facts

1.1 Ajman University (AU) at a Glance

Ajman University (AU) was founded in 1988 as Ajman University College of Science and Technology (AUCST) by virtue of an Emiri Decree issued by His Highness Sheikh Humaid Bin Rashid Al-Nuaimi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Ajman. AUCST received its first intake of students on 15 September 1988. On May 3, 1994, it was licensed by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research (MOHESR) as Ajman University of Science and Technology (AUST). Since then, AUST has continued its growth by expanding programs, diversifying the student population and faculty, strengthening ties with the community, improving positioning on the global map of higher education, and fostering a culture of shared governance and continuous improvement.

Until early 2019, AU operated with two campuses—one in Ajman and one in Fujairah. However, on March 18, 2019, the Fujairah campus became the independent University of Science and Technology of Fujairah (USTF), making AU a single-campus institution. This transition did not affect the academic programs or services at the Ajman campus.

Since its establishment, the University has experienced significant growth, expanding its academic offerings and diversifying its student body and faculty. In October 2016, the University adopted its current name, Ajman University (AU), to reflect the diversity of its academic programs. AU now offers 36 accredited programs, including 23 undergraduate programs, 1 postgraduate diplomas, 10 master's programs, and 2 doctoral programs, all recognized by the UAE Ministry of Education.

In Spring 2019, AU underwent significant academic restructuring, approved by the UAE Ministry of Education's Commission for Academic Accreditation (CAA). The restructuring involved merging the College of Information Technology with the College of Engineering to create the College of Engineering and Information Technology. Additionally, a new independent College of Architecture, Art, and Design was formed, while the College of Education and Basic Sciences and the College of Mass Communication and Humanities were reorganized into new colleges. During the same period, the College of Medicine was established, following the successful accreditation of its MBBS program.

AU's current academic structure includes nine colleges: The College of Architecture, Art, and Design; the College of Business Administration; the College of Dentistry; the College of Engineering and Information Technology; the College of Humanities and Sciences; the College of Mass Communication; the College of Law; the College of Medicine; and the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences.

In a landmark achievement during the academic year 2023-2024, AU became the first private, non-profit University in the UAE and the Arab region to receive accreditation from the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC), an accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. This accreditation highlights AU's commitment to academic excellence and global recognition.

AU's diverse community includes faculty members from 42 countries and students from 72 nationalities. The University has a vast alumni network of more than 40,000 graduates across 50 countries.

The above major changes have been appropriately reflected in the current Fact Book for Academic Year (AY) 2023-2024.






Chart 2.1.2 Five Year Trend New Registered Students (Undergraduate & Graduate) by College





Academic Year (AY) 2019-2020 to 2023-2024




Chart 2.1.5. New Registered Students by Degree Levels






Chart 2.1.6 Five Year Trend New Registered *Undergraduate* Students by Age





Chart 2.1.7 Five Year Trend New Registered *Graduate* Students by Age

Academic Year (AY) 2019-2020 to 2023-2024




Chart 2.2.2. Total Registered Students by Semester and Gender



Fall Semester 2019-2020 to 2023-2024





Chart 2.2.5. Total Registered Students by Degree Level (Spring Semester)








Progression Fall 2022-2023 to Fall 2023-2024



Chart 4.4.1. Graduates Statistics by Academic Programs



Chart 5.1.1. Faculty by Gender Academic Year (AY) 2023-2024




Chart 5.1.2. Faculty by Full-time (FT) and Part-time (PT) Employment Status






Chart 5.1.3. Full-time (FT) Faculty Nationality by Region




Chart 5.1.4. Full-time (FT) Faculty by Origin of Academic Degrees
Fall Semester 2023-2024




Chart 5.1.5. Full-time Faculty by Qualification

Fall 2019-2020 to Fall 2023-2024







Scopus Publications Per Calendar Year 2019-2023





Chart 6.1.2. Ajman University (AU) Scopus-indexed Publications Per Faculty

Scopus Publications Per Calendar Year 2019-2023



Academic Year (AY) 2023-2024





Chart 7.1.3. Academic Degree Programs Offered by Colleges

Appendix 3: CHEDS Definitions of Terms used in Fact Book

1. Overall Retention Rate

Student Retention Rate is the percentage of students who continue their studies at the same institution the following year, have not dropped out, have not been dismissed for any reason (disciplinary or academic), and have not postponed their registration. When UAE higher education institutions report the student retention rates to the Ministry of Education, they are to use the following formula:

Retention Rate = (S2 + G) / S1

Where,

S1 = Total number of students registered in courses in the fall semester of year 1

S2 = Total number of students from S1 continuing their studies (registered in courses) in the fall semester of year 2

G = Total number of graduates in Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters between Year 1 and Year 2 *Notes:*

- ✓ Students who are not active should not be included in the registered students count. For example, students who have postponed their registration will not be counted as registered students.
- ✓ Students on an exchange program at another university can be counted as registered but, in this case, exclude the incoming exchange students
- ✓ Students working on an internship, research project, or capstone project, which is a part of program requirements, will be counted as registered students
- This essentially means that the following students are counted as dropout students. Students who are:

Dismissed for academic reasons

Dismissed for disciplinary reasons

Withdrawn from university (complete withdrawal)

Have postponed registration for any reason (term withdrawal)

2. Progression Rate

Percentage of continuing students with a CGPA of >=2 for undergraduates and CGPA of >=3 for Postgraduates

3. Full-time Students

Undergraduate: A student enrolled for 12 or more semester credits, 12 or more quarter credits, or 24 or more contact hours a week each term.

Graduate: A student enrolled for 9 or more semester credits, or 9 or more quarter credits, or a student involved in thesis or dissertation preparation that is considered full-time by the institution.

4. Graduation Rate

A cohort is defined as all students who enter the Institution as full-time, first-time degree-seeking students during the fall term of a given academic year. A cohort is defined as the number of students graduating from a particular cohort, wherein the Graduation Rate is the percentage of students who complete their program within 1.5 times the standard length of the program. For example, the regular time for 120-credit-hour bachelor's standard length of time (tenure) to complete a Bachelor's program is 4 years; the standard program time for a Bachelor's program is 8 regular semesters and 1.5 times

that is 12 regular semesters. Hence, any graduate within 6 years is considered to have graduated within 1.5 times the standard tenure.

5. Part-time Students

Undergraduate: A student enrolled for either less than 12 semester or quarter credits or less than 24 contact hours a week each term.

Graduate: A student enrolled for less than 9 semester or quarter credits

6. Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Students

Use the following formula to calculate full-time equivalent students:

Students (FTE)= Full time students+ (1/3) part-time students

The full-time and part-time students have been defined as per the above definitions.

7. Faculty (adopted from IPEDS definition)

Persons identified by the institution as such and typically those whose initial assignments and principal activities are comprised of:

- ✓ conducting instruction and
- ✓ research and
- ✓ public/community service

They may hold academic rank titles of:

- ✓ Professor
- ✓ Associate professor
- ✓ Assistant professor
- ✓ Lecturer
- ✓ Or Equivalent of any of those academic ranks

Faculty may also include the chancellor/president, provost, vice provosts, deans, directors, or the equivalent, as well as associate deans, assistant deans, and executive officers of academic departments (chairpersons, heads, or the equivalent) if their principal activity is instruction combined with research and public service. Tutors/Instructors, Graduate Assistants, and Research Assistants are not considered faculty or included in this category.

8. Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Faculty

Full-time faculty members hold a full-time faculty contract with the university. The full-time equivalent (FTE) faculty is calculated by summing the total number of full-time faculty members, adding one-third of the total number of part-time faculty. Visiting faculty at your institution for a full semester can be counted among the part-time faculty. Use the following formula to calculate the faculty FTE:

Faculty (FTE) = Full time faculty + (1/3) part time faculty

9. Student Faculty Ratio (SFR)

Use the following formula to calculate SFR.

Student Faculty Ratio (SFR) = Total FTE Students / Total FTE Faculty

Use the FTE numbers and not the headcounts. The definitions of FTE Students and FTE Faculty are given above.
